### From the Tenth FCC Members' Impressions (excerpts)



[The Tenth FCC members state their impressions of attending the meetings.]

- How about holding an international cooking event or tea party? I think talking over Chinese tea will make for a good exchange. I think the easiest way to interact is to eat and drink something together and talk.
- When my children were still small, I didn't know that there was a playroom on the second floor of Sukoyaka Plaza, and only found out about it when a Japanese mother from the neighborhood invited me. At the time, I couldn't speak Japanese very well, and I felt the language barrier. How about creating a place where foreign mothers and children can get together once a month, so that foreigners can feel more comfortable visiting the facility?
- Create an opportunity for foreigners who have given birth in Japan to offer advice on their child-rearing experiences in their native language.
